

Programme aims



Encourage all adult social care providers to adopt a Digital Social Care Record system



Use technology to help the frailest care home residents to avoid preventable falls



Use technology to help address a major health and care need in Somerset (TBC)

In order to



Reduce errors in care provision by ensuring information about an individual's care needs and preferences is known to every professional and family involved in their care



Enable provider workforce to engage in digital more effectively



Reduce in the frequency and severity of incidents such as falls or medication errors leading to hospital admissions



Improve sharing of information so that ICS and commissioners can draw on timely and accurate data to inform commissioning, understand the needs and requirements of their local populations and manage health and social care services more effectively



Improve the productivity of care providers, for example by reducing the amount of time staff spend on paperwork and other routine tasks, to give care staff more time to spend interacting with people and delivering personalised care
